Parents' evenings are held every term throughout the year. You are invited to make an appointment using the Arbor App. Our next parents' evenings are taking place during the week beginning 16th October. If you don't already have an appointment, please log onto the App to make one. Parents' evenings are a great way to find out about your child's learning in school.

Throughout the year, we hold Stay and Play sessions in our Early Years department for our Nursery and Reception children, including 2-year-olds. We also host events for all age groups where parents are invited to learn alongside their children. For example, during Anti-Bullying week and World Book Day.

This year, we are also planning to host 'What am I learning?' evening events. We intend these evenings to be very informal. You will be invited to come into your child's classroom with your child, and see first hand some of the amazing work they have been doing.
